We are delighted that _____ will be assisting you and are confident that _____ will help to inform, prepare and empower you on your parenting adventure.

This letter establishes the specific terms and conditions of your responsibilities as employers.

Room: A private bedroom equipped with a comfortable bed, dresser, bed linens, towels, washcloths and wireless internet access will be provided. This bedroom can also be shared with the baby. A private or shared bathroom will be provided next to or on the same floor as baby nurse's bedroom

Board: The Babynurse may make reasonable food and drink purchases for meals and snacks during her grocery shops. Additionally, the Babynurse shall feel free to eat any food available in the employer's home.

Travelling with Family: When travelling, the employer will pay all travel costs including lodging, meals and any other expenses that arise out of travelling.

Travel Notice: Babynurse will ensure to provide Employer with travel dates and times relating to Babynurses breaks and time away at least Fifteen (15) days prior to travel day.

Extension of Employment: It has been previously discussed that Babynurse is open and prepared to extend initial assignment.

Resignation: Should Babynurse choose to leave before six months and if extended, a minimum of Fourteen (14) days of notice will be provided. Family will have the option of terminating babynurse immediately.

Early Termination: If after a Thirty day (30) acclimation period, Employer wishes to terminate the relationship with Babynurse; unless terminated for misconduct and/or cause, Employer will pay Baby Nurse six (6) weeks salary for loss of employment Or choose to pay for the completion of her six (6) month contract; whichever amount is less.
